East & West Spring Lake Wastewater Pilot Study

#### **Charlotte Assembly 2007**

Another factor affecting water quality is septic tanks. The number of septic tanks in the County affects groundwater quality, as well as water quality in Charlotte Harbor. The County should establish a plan with timelines for extending sewer lines to infill areas within the Urban Service Area currently served by septic tanks.



# First Time Assessment – East & West Spring Lake Wastewater MSBU

 Proposed assessment will allow CCU to expand wastewater services in a turn-key fashion to those parcels within the East & West Spring Lake area. The assessment is to include connection fees to occupied lots, which shall be kept separate from the infrastructure (capital cost) assessment.



- \$7,626.37 per occupied residential lot
- \$4,375.37 for each vacant lot

#### If assessed over 20 year period

- \$9,998.69 per occupied residential lot
- \$6,151.70 for each vacant lot



# First Time Assessment – East & West Spring Lake Wastewater MSBU

Costs allocated by ERU – 2455 parcels impacted

Infrastructure fee: \$379.51 (occupied)

\$307.59 (vacant)

Hookup fee: \$120.43 (occupied only)



### East & West Spring Lake Wastewater Potential Revenues

- CCU will be applying for a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) that would provide financial assistance to low income homeowners.
- The BP RESTORE Grant has been applied for and funding is pending the outcome of the claim settlement.
- DEP Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) Water Quality Restoration Grant was submitted but denied due to no permit for the project at this time. Will reapply as project moves forward and meets this requirement.
- CCU and the County will continue to look for grant and funding opportunities to help defray the total cost of the project.
